Organizing exchange visit, internship, workshop for all development practitioners, policy makers, commune council, farmer representative etc 2. Organizing training, exchange and advisory support for farmer representatives in collective marketing of high-valued agricultural product, collective buying of commodities/goods and agricultural inputs management of saving and credit services 3. Organizing training, coaching and advisory support to the community-based input supplies, especially fingerling, piglet, rice and vegetable seed and tree seedling and also facilitating to establish of district association of input providers 4. Organizing training, coaching, exchange and advisory for representatives of farmer association on management and capacity building to young farmer, woman and poorest group 5. Support the village based association in developing and implementing regulation on conservations of community-based natural resources 6. Organizing project advisory committee meeting, with the participation of PDA, CCs, FA representatives and other stakeholders <p>(Output)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Representative of government agencies, commune councils, NGOs, donors and farming communities in other parts of Cambodia understand CEDAC approach in agriculture and rural development and have access to experiences and lessons learned from the project in Tramkok. - Support the establishment of self-managed and self-financed village-based farmer associations and cooperative business network in Tramkok . - Support the development of network of community based service and input providers in agricultural extension and agricultural inputs - Farmer associations are supported to provide services contributing to overall local development. <p>(Indicators)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Over 75 % of farmer families in Tramkok are able to increase food production and income around 30 % (from around 500-800 to 650-1000 USD per family per year), especially through improved production and co-operative business - Farmers in Tramkok have access to responsible services provided by member-managed village based farmer association and networks, especially marketing, agricultural information, input and supplies, credit and saving and mutual help or solidarity fund.
