



Title of the project	Creating Sustainable Livelihoods for the Sok San Indigenous Community in Mondulkiri province
Goal of project	<p>Goal: to improve livelihoods of indigenous people through ecological agriculture dissemination and local human resources development</p> <p>Specific objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Improving food production of farmers through dissemination of ecologically sensitive agriculture innovation such as system of rice intensification, upland rice, diversification of crops, ecological chicken raising, fish and frog raising. - Capacity building of indigenous local people to be key farmers on specific thematic issues for disseminating agriculture innovation as well as social group mobilization - Building capacity of indigenous youth, particularly women so that they could be community leaders or facilitators for development projects in Mondulkiri province.

Main Activities, Expected Output, and Indicators	<p>Main Activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Village general meeting to select interested farmer - Exposure visit of interested farmers - Training of farmers on agriculture innovation Farmer exchange intra village - Village general meeting to share innovation - Evaluation workshop - Monthly capacity building to key farmers - Exposure trip for key farmers - Capacity building of indigenous youth - CEDAC quarterly monitoring - Project evaluation <p>Expected outputs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 100 families will have increased food production by 50% through improvement in yields and diversity (not through increase in land use) - 20 key farmers will have improved capacity in agricultural production and have increased production - 8 saving groups will be mobilized with an average of 15 families as member per group. - 4 village-based farmer associations will be set up and link together as a cluster-based farmer association network - 2 indigenous youth will be trained to provide training to the community on agriculture innovation - Agriculture innovation will be documented as training material for the other organizations to use in their respective target areas in Mondulkiri province.
