

CEDAC is providing opportunities for foreign students to learn about rural development in Cambodia

Five student trainees (2 women) from the Ecole Supérieure d'Agro-Développement International/College of International Agro-Development (ISTOM) University, France, are now doing internships with CEDAC for three months from July 1 to September 29, 2010. During this internship period, the students will spend most of their time learning from different development projects of CEDAC including the Community Business Support Program (CBSP), Improving Food Security for Women and the Rural Poor in Mondulhiri Province (IFWP-MP), and the Development of Food Production, Farming Incomes, Nutrition and Resilience in Rural Cambodia (FF-PV&SR) Project in Prey Veng and Svay Rieng Province.

To date, around 50 foreign students from many countries including France, Japan, Netherlands, USA, UK, Belgium, Australia, and a hundred Cambodian students from different universities in Cambodia have interned with and visited CEDAC for their thesis and study research.

With this, CEDAC has built its image as a very active and popular organization in terms of agriculture and rural development as well as rural capacity building among national and international public audiences including farmers, rural youth, students, researchers, policymakers and government officials.
